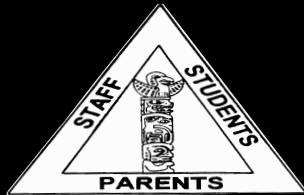

RE: AP Scholar Awards

Seventy-eight students at Sammamish High School have earned the designation of AP Scholar by the College Board in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school, and to receive college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. About 18 percent of the more than 1.4 million high school students in more than 16,000 secondary schools worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to merit the recognition of AP Scholar.

Students took AP Exams in May 2007 after completing challenging college-level courses at their high schools. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP Exams.

At Sammamish High School two students qualified for the National AP Scholar Award by earning an average grade of 4 or higher on a 5-point scale on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams. These students are Kathleen Kamikawa and Rebecca Spadoni.

No one qualified for a State Scholar Award. The designation of State AP Scholar is granted to the one male and one female student in each U.S. state and the District of Columbia with grades of 3 or higher on the greatest number of AP Exams (at least three exams) **and then** the highest average grade (at least 3.5) on all AP Exams taken.

Thirteen students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, **and** grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. Most of the nation's colleges and universities award credit, advanced placement, or both based on successful performance on the AP Exams. More than 1,400 institutions award a full year's credit (sophomore standing) to students presenting a sufficient number of qualifying grades. In 2007, thirty-seven AP Exams were offered in a wide variety of subject areas, each consisting of multiple-choice and free-response (essay or problem solving or oral response) questions (except for the Studio Art exam which evaluates students' original artwork).

The College Board is a not-for-profit membership organization whose mission is to connect students to college success and opportunity. Founded in 1900, the association is composed of more than 5,200 schools, colleges, universities, and other educational organizations. Each year, the College Board serves seven million students and their parents, 23,000 high schools, and 3,500 colleges through major programs and services in college admissions, guidance, assessment, financial aid, enrollment, and teaching and learning. Among its best-known programs are the SAT, the PSAT/NMSQT, and the Advanced Placement Program (AP). The College Board is committed to the principles of excellence and equity and that commitment is embodied in all of its programs, services, activities, and concerns.

Senior Class Fundraising: Why Do We Do It?

Classes begin raising funds as early as their Freshmen year to help pay for all the many activities/events that occur their Senior year such as:

All-Night Senior Grad Party

All-Night Senior Party- For many years, Sammamish High School has promoted an "All-Night" Senior Party. Graduating seniors board buses following the graduation ceremony and attend a specially designed party. The seniors are then returned to Sammamish at approximately 6:00 a.m. the next morning. The *primary* function of the Senior Party is to provide our students with a very safe and moderated celebration for their academic achievement. In other communities, and even other schools in the Bellevue School District, many graduates will host their own celebrations in empty second homes or hotel rooms. As you can guess, these students may get involved in the consumption of alcohol and put their lives and their friends' lives in danger. This is why it is so important that we host a Senior Party to provide an alternative for our students.

The approximate cost of this all-night party is over \$25,000 (about \$166 per person for 150 students to attend). This includes rental of the party venues, entertainment, food and transportation.

Parents start working as early as freshman year to raise funds so that the party will be more affordable. The more money we raise, the cheaper the ticket price is for the students.

Our number one goal and vision is to create events that are inclusive and accessible by ALL students of the Class of 2007. If you are interested in helping with the Senior Events fundraising efforts, please contact your Class Parent Rep.

Counselors Corner

SHS COUNSELING WEBSITE: Have you checked out the new SHS Counseling Website? Just click on the link, "SHS Counseling Center" from the SHS website. You can email your student's counselor directly from this site as well as view and print frequently requested forms. At our website you can also view our calendar listing all the college representative visits that are coming to Sammamish. This is a great resource for students to better understand the college admissions process and learn more about particular schools. Great links to college resources, our course catalog, daily bulletin, Parent Internet Viewer (view your son or daughter's grades), and the districts new Curriculum Web are also available at the site, as well as links to websites for both students and parents that deal with issues related to the social and emotional concerns of teenagers.

1st QUARTER ENDS November 8th. Grades will be mailed out the week of November 20th. First quarter grades represent the first half of the semester (two semesters in a year). **Quarter grades are not placed on student's transcripts, only semester grades.** You can access your student's grades online at <https://grades.bsd405.org/shs/piv.exe>. Shelley Anderson in the attendance office can give you your student's password in person.

TUTORIAL REMINDER: Encourage your student to attend tutorial from 2:35 pm – 3:05 pm every day except Wednesdays. All teachers are available to help with homework, answer questions, and to particularly assist students who may be falling behind in class. Some teachers require tutorial if a student is performing poorly. This time can be extremely helpful! **Please feel free to email or call your student's teachers directly if you are concerned about their progress.**

TOTEM REACH – Peer Tutoring: Totem Reach is a peer tutoring program held every Monday, Tuesday & Thursday from 2:30 – 4:00 PM. On Wednesday tutoring is available from 12:20 – 4:00 PM. Totem Reach is held in room 937 (upstairs of library).

COMMUNITY SERVICE REMINDER: The majority of seniors have either not completed their 40 hour requirement, or have not documented it by filling out the form available in the counseling center. **Seniors will not graduate without fulfilling this requirement!** Come to the Counseling or Career Center to get ideas for great opportunities.

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS - Be Planful! Be sure to know your college deadlines and give your counselor and teachers three school weeks time to write letters of recommendation. If your application is due by January 1, **requests for letters must be to your counselor by December 1.** The University of Washington scholarship priority deadline is December 1st, while the UC system and many California state universities have a firm November 30th deadline. Be vigilant in knowing these deadlines and entrance requirements. See their web pages for details.

PSAT & PLAN RESULTS: will be sent to Sammamish in late December or early January. Counselors will offer workshops in December and January on how to read your results and what to interpret from them.

COMMON APPLICATION: If you are applying to a school that uses the Common Application, you **will** need a letter of recommendation from your counselor. Please make an appointment to request this.

SAT vs ACT: Most colleges accept either the SAT or the ACT college entrance test. You may take the tests more than once, and colleges will count the highest scores you receive. Students should plan to take them in the spring of their junior year and if necessary the fall of their senior year. Register online for the SAT at www.collegeboard.com and the ACT at www.actstudent.org.

COLLEGE VISITS TO SHS: Go to the SHS Counseling Center website and/or listen to the Daily Bulletins for College Rep visitations! Students from all grades are welcome to meet with the representatives from colleges as they visit. Please see Ms. Chomik in the counseling center to receive a pass. This is a great opportunity to ask the college reps questions! The following schools are scheduled to visit SHS the week of Nov5-8: **Univ. Colorado Boulder, Pacific University, Gonzaga , Princeton, , Mt. Holyoke, Montana State, Colorado State, Boise State**

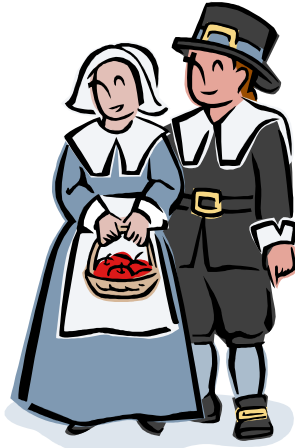

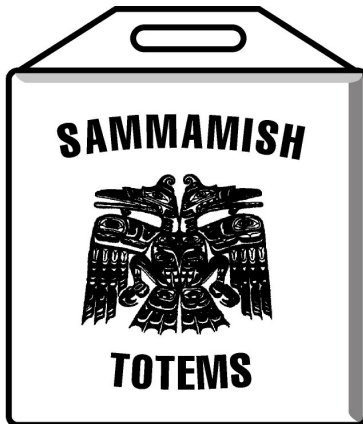
Winter Sports Turnout Begins November 5th

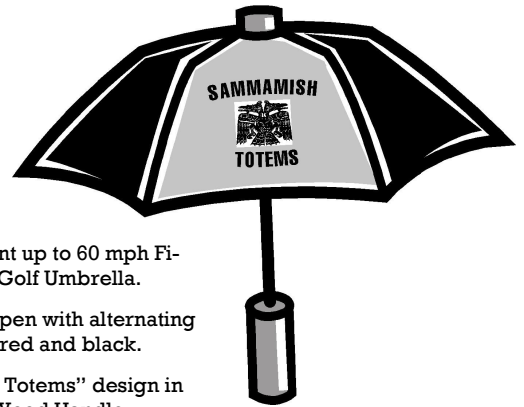

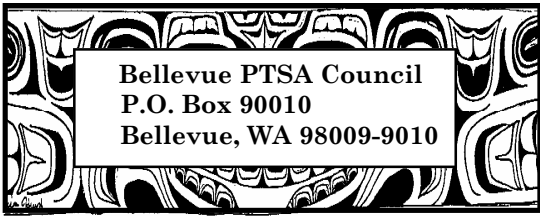
